Marcus Brown is Chief of Police of the Maryland Transportation Authority Police Department, a position he has held since 2007. The Maryland Transportation Authority Police, a CALEA accredited agency, has over 500 sworn and 100 civilian employees. The Department is responsible for law enforcement at the Authority's highways, tunnels and bridges, the Baltimore-Washington International Thurgood Marshall Airport, the Port of Baltimore, and the Maryland Motor Vehicle Administration.

Prior to joining the MDTA Police, he spent 15 years in the Baltimore Police Department, retiring at the rank of Deputy Commissioner. In this capacity, he directed the Department's Operations Bureau, which consisted of 3,000 employees. He led the Department's patrol, criminal investigations, homeland security, and organized crime functions. His efforts in implementing a new crime reduction strategies contributed to 30-year low in the City's crime rate. Prior to joining the Baltimore Police Department, he served as a police officer in the San Jose, California, Police Department.

He is one of the most active chiefs of police in the Mid-Atlantic Region in supporting law enforcement and community organizations. Under his leadership, the Maryland Transportation Authority Police has provided support to the National Organization of Black Law Enforcement Executives (NOBLE), Mid-Atlantic Association of Women in Law Enforcement, Maryland Chiefs of Police Association (MCPA), and many others. He currently serves as 2nd Vice President of the Maryland Chiefs of Police Association and is Co-Chair of the Association's Traffic Committee.

Brown holds a law degree from the University of Baltimore, School of Law, and a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration from Pennsylvania State University.
