Officer Luciana Hall began her career with the Arlington, Texas, Police Department, as a recruit, in August of 2007. Due to her immediate demonstration of leadership among her peers in the academy, she was selected by her classmates to deliver the class speech on graduation day. As a patrol officer handling a variety of complex calls in one of the city's busiest districts, she has been selected by her superiors to complete special assignments, including addressing burglaries in the Arlington Independent School District and reviewing fellow officers' reports to see whether they contain probable cause to support the arrest. In July of 2008, Officer Hall was awarded the Peak Performer Award for the east Arlington district for outstanding self-initiated activity. In addition, she was a nominee for Rookie of the Year in 2008. She has received multiple letters of commendation from her superiors for her dedication and hard work.

Prior to her tenure at Arlington PD, Officer Hall began her law enforcement career working as an adult probation officer with the Dallas County Adult Probation and Community Corrections agency. She managed 125 felony and misdemeanor cases, ranging from minimum to maximum supervision levels.
