Katherine Weinstein Miller is the Chief of Alternative Programs and Initiatives in the Office of San Francisco District Attorney George Gascón, where she oversees the office's alternative courts, Neighborhood Courts/Prosecution program, juvenile work and non-prosecutorial initiatives. She has been at the office for six years, previously serving as Assistant District Attorney for truancy and reentry, Managing Attorney and Director of Policy.

Prior to joining the DA's Office in 2007, Katy was the Director of Strategic Planning at Goodwill Industries of San Francisco, San Mateo and Marin Counties where she focused on workforce development and offender programs. Katy spent five years at the San Francisco Mayor's Office, where she oversaw juvenile justice policy and program development. Prior to joining the Mayor's Office, Katy worked for the Delancey Street Foundation on a project with the City to reform its juvenile justice system. Before entering the field of policy and programs, Katy spent two years in the San Diego Public Defender's Office, and one year at the law firm of Gibson, Dunn & Crutcher.
