Major J.C. Perry has been a member of the Raleigh, North Carolina, Police Department since 1991, where he currently serves as the Division Commander of the Field Operations Division. During his career in this agency he has served as a patrol officer, field training officer, and on the Drugs and Vice Unit, ATF Task Force, Robbery Task Force, and Internal Affairs Unit. He led the department's Homicide Squad for four years. Chief Harry Dolan observed that because of Perry's forward looking, inspirational style, coupled with a demonstrated ability to lead, among his colleagues and subordinates he is considered the "future" of North Carolina's Capital City Police Department.
