Board Certified Police and Public Safety Psychologist (ABPP) with thirty-five years in the public sector characterized by a strong record of executive leadership and national criminal justice policy positions, both at the Federal and local levels. Created innovative public safety initiatives in response to pressing criminal justice needs and has been recognized as a national expert on criminal justice policy, public safety and policing issues. Significant Washington experience and participant in initiatives such as: Brookings Institution, Crime Control in Metropolitan America; RAND Corp, Advisory Board for Leadership Training; Steering Committee--Harvard Executive Session on Policing and Public Safety (2009-2011); Member-DOJ Team to assess civil rights issues in New Orleans PD; and member of the DOJ Monitoring Team for the Seattle Police Department.

A highlight of an active career was the Presidential appointment as Deputy Director, National Institute of Justice (DOJ) and as National HIDTA Director, ONDCP, Executive Office of the President (2009-2012). The appointment followed tenure as the Director of the John Jay Leadership Academy (2007-2009, John Jay College of Criminal Justice, which followed an appointment as Deputy Superintendent, Chicago Police Department, Bureau of Administrative Services (2004-07), the second largest police department in the country. Served as a consultant to the FBI (Office of Law Enforcement Coordination), and was Deputy Director of the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (U.S. DOJ/ COPS Office). In the latter position, created a national training strategy that involved a nationwide network of innovative Regional Community Policing Institutes (RCPI); had oversight of the Police Integrity Program; and coordinated the *U.S. Attorney General's National Conference and Presidential Roundtable: Strengthening Police and Community Relationships (1999)*. Have held academic positions, developed a history of publications, and was recognized as an O.W. Wilson Fellow and by Who's Who in America 2014.
