

## Jason Stamps



Jason Stamps is the Director of the Professional Training Division at the Northwestern University Center for Public Safety (NUCPS) where he is the administrator for training programs in three of the four NUCPS training divisions. He previously worked as the Director of New Programs and as an Associate Director in the Management Training Division where he managed the two week Supervision of Police Personnel course. His duties also include serving as an instructor in the School of Police Staff and Command, lecturing on resource allocation and deployment.

Prior to coming to NUCPS, Stamps worked for the Institute for Public Safety Partnerships (IPSP) at the University of Illinois at Chicago (UIC). Starting as a research assistant for IPSP, he served in a variety of capacities, rising to the position of Assistant Director of Operations. As Assistant Director, he was responsible for budgeting and managing over \$2.1 million in federal grants from the U.S. Department of Justice Office of Community Oriented Policing and the Bureau of Justice Assistance. His research activities included developing and implementing a research protocol to study the effectiveness of the UIC Clery mandatory reporting system meant to standardize and ensure the reporting of instances of sexual assault, domestic abuse and stalking on campus. Stamps served on the UIC Office of Women's Affairs Campus Advocacy Network oversight committee monitoring this project. He also provided instrument development and performed data analysis for several police departments in response to traffic stop data collection efforts mandated by the state of Illinois in 2003.

He has taught in the areas of statistics and research methods and criminological theory at Prairie State College and Governors State University, and has also been a guest lecturer for multiple graduate seminars on topics ranging from anthropological criminology to anomie and strain theory. Prior to moving to Illinois, he worked as a dispatcher and 911 operator for the Tuscaloosa, Alabama, Police Department, serving in all capacities within the Communications Division.

Stamps earned his B.A. in Criminal Justice from the University of Alabama and M.A. in Criminal Justice from the University of Illinois at Chicago. His graduate work there focused on statistical methods and quantitative and qualitative research methods and analysis. He is currently pursuing a M.A. in Public Policy and Administration at Northwestern University.
