Jennifer S. White began her law enforcement career in 1994 as an officer with the Arlington, Texas, Police Department and served in various assignments including property crimes detective, narcotics detective, management initiatives supervisor, and gang detective supervisor. She was appointed Deputy Chief in 2008. She received a Bachelor's Degree in Criminal Justice from Texas Christian University with minors in Biology and Sociology and a Master's in Public Administration from the University of Texas at Arlington. She is a graduate of the Institute for Law Enforcement Administration Management College and the Senior Management Institute for Police. She is a member of the International Association of Chiefs of Police.

In 2002 White led an effort by the police department to adopt verified alarm response to commercial and residential alarms that ultimately resulted in the department implementing, "no permit, no response," which significantly increased alarm permit revenue and reduced commercial and residential alarm calls for service. In 2008 she developed and managed a multifaceted approach to reducing crime in the city's entertainment district that resulted in dramatic reductions in drug and prostitution offenses. The project was a finalist for the 2008 Herman Goldstein Award for Problem Oriented Policing.
